Skills Workshop Recap

The APRA-IN Annual Skills Workshop took place at Earlham College on August 11, 2016. We were very excited to have Bond Lammey, Managing Associate for Bentz-Whaley-Flessner, as our keynote speaker. Bond started her career in Prospect Research, so she had many excellent insights to share from her own experience as well as her work with many other clients. Her keynote focused possible career trajectories of the prospect researcher. I found the concept of "negotiate for the job you want, not the job you have" to be a particularly intriguing idea.

On the Advanced Skills track, Bond also presented an excellent overview of how to dive into wealth screening results. Not only did we learn the basics step-by-step of a wealth screening, but she had some new ideas around reporting and showing the value of a screening to management, boards and major gifts officers. One idea that caught my attention was tracking the time from verification to the first gift by a new donor. That was one of many suggestions of alternative ways to show the value of a screening rather than just tallying up the number of "million dollar donors" uncovered.

Communications

Chair: Jennifer Book

The communications committee works to provide detailed and thorough communications to the entire Indiana chapter through quarterly newsletters, email updates and social media. The committee works with other researchers and data analysts to provide new and helpful articles to improve the skills and knowledge of our members, provide updates on upcoming events, recognize our members and share the work of the entire chapter. Programming
